



VENTURA COUNTY VERSUS HATE

partnership with the California Department of Civil Rights for the statewide California Versus program Interface 211VC Hate. launching our own campaign: Ventura County Versus Hate. This program works to increase systemic equality and fill social by promoting services gaps that treat individuals fairly and justly, regardless of their race, ethnicity, gender, sexual gender identity, or culture.

According to Health Matters in VC, there was a 40% increase in hate crimes in Ventura County from 2020 to 2021.

As part of the program, 211VC has a specialized team trained to respond to reports of hate crimes committed across California. This team assesses the caller's safety, determines

need for the emergency provides assistance. and connections to local resources for physical and mental health support. It will also callers in submitting reports and requests for assistance to the Department of Justice.

211VC is committed to raising awareness in the county about program to the promote Ventura County as a safe place for every community member by advocating to establish a Hate Crime Awareness Week. This will coincide with Pride Month and Juneteenth, which serves as a perfect conduit to help build awareness in racial, ethnic. and LGBTOA+ communities.


